In the ten days since Click Off sent our first email enquiry to officials at Warwickshire County Council (WCC) Metro, The Telegraph and The Times have covered the withdrawal of the Respect Yourself Guidance. Click Off understand more articles are to follow and that we are far from the first organisation to raise concerns.

Such coverage is clearly detrimental to the image of WCC. Furthermore, the lack of response from either Ms Fogarty or Cllrs Davies and Seacombe, could be cited as evidence that the individuals responsible for the publication of the Respect Yourself guidance are unable to defend the content. As with all public bodies WCC has a duty to be open and accountable.

Given this, Click Off would like to take this opportunity to remind you of the questions first raised over a week ago as below:

Given that the Respect Yourself website has now been suspended it seems fair to assume that this is an admission that the content is not suitable for the target age group- please clarify the official reason for the withdrawal of the website.

Who will conduct the review into the Respect Yourself guidance?

What questions will be asked?

Will parents and interest groups be able to feed into this review?
